A. J. is an author, speaker, teacher and cyclist. Her two-book speculative series - HIVE and ROGUE - has recently been released by Pan Macmillan, A. J.'s bestselling third novel, ZAC & MIA, won the 2012 Text Prize and the 2014 Ethel Turner prize for young adults at the NSW Premier's Literary Awards. ZAC & MIA is available in 14 countries.



Jenna Guillaume is a freelance journalist and author based in Sydney, Australia. She writes about pop culture, identity, feminism and social media. Previously, she was editor-at-large for BuzzFeed Australia, and before that she worked in the features department at Girlfriend magazine. What I Like About Me is her debut novel.





